# NOTICE TO ALL LICENSED CHILD CARE FACILITIES

This notice is to advise licensed child care facilities and advisory groups that a copy of proposed changes to Rule 386, Children's Product Safety has been posted to the DCFS website and the DCFS Sunshine Site. A summary of proposed changes includes:

### Section 386.30 General Requirements

# Information to be provided to child care facilities:

- A written explanation of the relevant provisions of Section 5.2 of the Child Care Act of 1969 and the Children's Product Safety Act in plain, non-technical language.
- A link to the comprehensive list of children's products that have been identified by the Illinois Department of Public Health as being unsafe as defined in the Children's Product Safety Act.
- Periodic updates of the Illinois Department of Public Health's list of unsafe children's products.

### Section 386.40 Licensing Compliance

• Facilities shall inspect its premises and immediately dispose of any unsafe children's products discovered. This inspection shall be documented by signing and dating a form prescribed by the Department, certifying there are no unsafe children's products on the premises.
