Complete and submit an application to provide an Emergency Day Care Program pursuant to Department EMERGENCY Rules 407: Subpart J. Demonstrate compliance with Rules 407.515 for employees authorized to work under Executive Order 2020-10, including minimum licensing standards and social distancing guidelines. Submit to required background checks and on-site visits.
• License Exempt Programs	Day programs exempt from licensure under Title 89 of the Illinois Administrative Code, Sections 377.3(a)(1)-(a)(4), (b)(2), and (c); day programs exempt from licensure under Title 89 of the Illinois Administrative Code, Section 377.3(d) (subject to the conditions governing exempt day care homes set forth in Section 12(s) of this Executive Order), such as YMCA programs, and programs recognized by ISBE.	Programs may only care for children of employees authorized to work under Executive Order 2020-10, observing the rules of social distancing, and not exceeding 10 children in one room.
