SUPPLEMENTAL STATEMENT OF EXPLANATION Date: September 1, 2022

Question #4: During the past year, has the agency been a named party in any civil court actions in relation to the provision of foster care or adoption services?

1. Travis Bartell, for minor AB v. Lutheran Social Services of Illinois, Thomas Williams and Goldie Williams (Case No. 22LL00010 – McDonough County Circuit Court, filed July 8, 2021).

Summary: Mr. T Bartell, the biological father of minor AB, brought this suit on behalf of the minor, who is in traditional foster care. The minor and a friend (both young teenagers at the time of the incident) were at a park near the foster home. The complaint alleges that the minor and her friend (i) left the park in a car driven by a man or male teenager, (ii) stayed at a home in another town, and (iii) were sexually abused during that time. The complaint alleges that Lutheran Social Services of Illinois ("LSSI") was negligent, and was willfully and wantonly disregarding with respect to, both (1) in LSSI's licensing of the foster home/parents and (2) in performing its duties/casework. The Complaint was dismissed by the Court for want of prosecution; however, Mr. Bartell can refile the complaint by November 2, 2022.

2. Campbell, Chariot v. LSSI, LSSI caseworkers, other agencies and caseworkers, and two Galesburg police officers (Case No. 22-4013, Central District of Illinois, filed January 21, 2022).

Summary: Ms. C. Campbell, biological mother, filed a pro se federal civil rights action against LSSI, its caseworks, other agencies and caseworkers, and Galesburg police officers. Ms. Campbell's children were placed in foster care and the allegations in the complaint allege various wrongdoings by each of the defendants during the investigation, placement and foster care related to placement of her minor children in foster care. The complaint has not been properly served and, to date, LSSI is not aware of any activity in this case.

3. Krompart, S. v. LSSI (Small Claims Case, filed May 12, 2022, Winnebago County)

Summary: Ms. Krompart filed a small claims complaint alleging that LSSI misrepresented information during an underlying parental rights case involving Ms. Krompart and her children. LSSI's legal counsel filed a motion to dismiss the complaint and a ruling on the motion is expected on September 29, 2022.

4. Gimino, Emily v. LSSI (Case No. 22 CV 03397, Northern District of Illinois, filed June 27, 2022)

Summary: Ms. E. Gimino brought a pro se federal civil rights complaint against LSSI and LSSI's caseworker. Ms. Gimino is the fiancé of the biological father of the three minors whose parental rights were terminated by the State of Illinois in November, 2021. Ms. Gimino's complaint alleges various wrongdoing against LSSI, DCFS and LSSI's caseworkers. She seeks return of the children to her fiancé, their biological father, and damages of \$8M. The complaint has not been properly served and, to date, LSSI knows of no activity on this case.

5. In re: Minor CH (Motions brought in Macon County pending juvenile matter, filed September 21, 2021)

Summary: Biological father of CH, a minor in foster care, brought a motion to remove LSSI and a motion for sanctions against LSSI and its caseworker seeking damages. The motions allege that LSSI's caseworker disclosed confidential information to a third party. The Juvenile Court granted the motion to remove LSSI and dismissed the motion for sanctions. LSSI is no longer involved in the juvenile matter.
